Notice of Outcome of NEC vs Robert Pitt

I am writing regarding the disciplinary charges against you that were recently presented to the National Constitutional Committee (**NCC**) by the National Executive Committee (**NEC**).

A panel of the National Constitutional Committee (**the Panel**) recently met and considered the NEC case and your answer to charge.

Having carefully considered the information before it, the Panel determined that it would be appropriate for this case to be determined without convening a hearing, in accordance with paragraph 19 of the Procedural Guidelines.

With careful consideration of all the written submissions and documents before it, the Panel, upon the balance of probabilities, decided as follows regarding the charges presented:

Charge 1: Refusal to complete, 'Sanctions Training: Antisemitism' module, 2022-2024

Mr Pitt has repeatedly failed to complete an antisemitism training module declared to be mandatory by the National Executive Committee (NEC). In breach of Chapter 2, Clause 1.11 of the Labour Party Rule Book.

The Panel found Charge 1 **PROVEN**.

- The NCC Panel found evidence that you have not completed required Sanction Training, and this is prejudicial and grossly detrimental to the Labour Party.

The NCC's Decision

Having found Charge 1 against you proven, the Panel moved to consider appropriate disciplinary measures in respect of Charge 1.

Accordingly, the Panel agreed that you should be **EXPELLED** from membership of the Labour Party.

Decisions of the NCC are final and not subject to appeal.

Membership Reapplication

Chapter 6, Clause 1.2 of the Rules provides that the National Executive Committee will not normally consider any application for re-admission to the Labour Party until a minimum of five years has elapsed from the date of your expulsion from membership of the Labour Party.
